I doth I leave to my brother Simon S. Westbrook all my estate both real and personal during his natural life: and if to the sd. S. S. Westbrook should marry and have lawful issue, I, in that event give an bequeath an to him the said Simon Turner Westbrook all my Estate before named.

2nd. And should my brother Simon Westbrook die without marrying and having the lawful issue before named, it is my wish and desire that my Estate both real and personal be equally divided between the surviving children of myself, John Westbrook and Josl Westbrook, son. In the event that none of those children be surviving it is my wish that all my Estate both real and personal shall be sold by my representative, and paid over to the Treasurer of the Greenville, Widow's Son Lodge No 150 if in existence for the benefit of sa. Lodge,
