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7 July 1834 I Edmund Turner of the County of Northampton & State of North Carolina, do make & appoint this
 my last will & testament I leave to my wife Sarah Turner during her life a tract of Land (purchased of Mr. Pender
 this day known by the name of the Valley and tract lying in the County of Northampton and State of Virginia, part of
 death, the said Land to equally divide between James Treigant Lewis to Treigant John D. Turner.

Item I give unto my wife two good work horses not of the black mares stock, three hours of labor I own & pay 400
 shanks I also give her horse & fork for the support of her & family one year, also fifty sellers, also all the stock
 that has not been sold of all kinds whatsoever that has been brought to my house, also 2 plows & gear & one year
 ing seed & seedling seed.

Item I give unto James Treigant one fourth of my negroes including the number which I have given him here
 before, at their value at the time they were given, also one bed & furniture, which he has received.

Item I give unto Lewis L. Treigant one fourth of my negroes including the number which I have given him here
 before at their value at the time they were given, also one bed and furniture which he has received.

Item I give unto John D. Turner one fourth of my negroes including the number which I have given him here
 before at their value at the time they were given, also one bed & furniture which he has received.

Item I give unto John D. Turner all the lands not otherwise disposed of that I own lying (being) in the State of
 Virginia & North Carolina.

Item my stock of every description, house hold & kitchen furniture, not otherwise disposed of, (plantation tools
 bells, hogheads and barrels of all my stock, if any, on hand, I wish sold.

Item I appoint Solomon Barnes James H. Wood James Jackson Nathaniel Williams & Joseph M. Day
 or any three of them, to divide my negroes between my 4 legacies equally.

Item I appoint my son John D. Turner as my only Executor of this my last will & testament.

Item I have to any money or notes left after my debts are paid I wish it to be equally divided between John
 Treigant Lewis L. Treigant John D. Turner & Richard Mason. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & seal as above written.
