J. Josiah Cobb, of the County of Southampton being blessed by Almighty God, in this my twenty-sixth year with a sound mind and disposing memory do make, constitute and appoint this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say

First. In addition to the third part of my land and negroes which the law would give my wife Martha she is now in my estate I give to her and her heirs one her and furniture and I leave unto her my negro girl Zena (the negro) to be held by her until such time as my Grand daughter Eliza Ann Cobb, daughter of my son John Cobb, shall attain the age of sixteen or in event of her death until such time as she would have attained the age of sixteen had she survived. Should my said Grand daughter live to attain the age of sixteen then from and after that period give unto her and her heirs forever said negro Zena. I also give to my Wife one fourth part of any profits that may remain in the hands of my executor after the payment of my debt and necessary expenses in his satisfaction of any part of said profits to which she would be entitled to but for this provision.

Secondly I give and devise my tract of land to my sons James and David including the necessary interest in the part assigned to my Wife - the dividing line to commence where as formerly and then formerly stood on my lot but which has been blown down, being the points where the lands belonging to the estate of Mr. Edwards and Thomas Hancock corner, and said dividing line so to crop the land as to divide it into two parts of equal value.

Third. To my son Josiah I give and bequeath one half of the valuation of my Tract of land which is now given to my sons James and David, but then as it will be with my wife's consent, said valuation to be paid to her in a negro or negroes, the land and negroes to be valued by such persons as may be appointed and appointed the deval in the land and negroes.

Fourthly. To my sons David and Josiah I give one bed and furniture each.

Fifthly. All the rest of my estate of what sort or kind soever not herein before disposed off I leave to be equally divided among my sons James, David and Josiah.

Sixthly. I nominate and appoint Stephen Murchough, Executor to this my last will and testament, in the only whereof I set my hand and affix my seal this seventh day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven
