In the first place, I direct all my just debts to be paid.

In the second place, I give and bequeath unto Leonard Turner, one of the Indians to be my slave, my bed
and bedding, one horse, one half yearling, one sow, his choice, my farming utensils, all my household and kitchen
necessities to him and his heirs forever also I give him all the bacon corn and fodder on hand at my death with
four house spigs.
