 to Turner's ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit

First In the first place, I direct all my just debts to be paid.

In the second place, I give and bequeath unto Coarun Turner, one of the Indians tribes my slave, my best

and best, one horse, one bull, one cow, one sow, his choice, my farming utensils, all my household and kitchen
 furniture to him and his heirs forever. also I give him all the bacon corn and fodder on hand at my death and all
 four house pigs.
