In stating the transactions of James Myrick's Curator of Joseph Harris, it will appear that, in the 1830 there is an item paid N. Parsons \$4.50 twice charged to the estate; and in the same year, Sep 22d the Curator has credit for \$3.00 paid J. Gorse, Guardian &c when it should be \$3.00 - so by deducting the first named item from the latter it will appear that the Curator should have a further credit of \$22.67 with interest thereon from the 24th day of Decr. 1830 to the 26th of May 1836 to wit.

1836 May 26th. By balance of Interest due the estate \$132.03
To the above error 22.67

In on ditto 5 yrs 4 mos 26 days 7.35 30.92
which a balance of Interest due the estate \$102.01
instead of the former balance of \$132.03.
