 a witness thereto and continued. and at a Court held for the said County the 15<sup>th</sup> day of  
 September 1838. the same was proved by the oath of George Hurton another witness thereto and  
 ordered to be recorded. And Henry Hindred the executor therein named. appearing in Court  
 and offering to take upon himself the burthen of the execution of said will. it was ordered that the  
 estate of the said Martha Whannel be committed to the hands of James D Chespenburg Sheriff of  
 of this County for administration according to law

In the name of God Amen I James Worrell Sr of the County of Southampton being  
 of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament in the follow  
 ing manner. first my will is for all my just debts to be paid out of my estate soon after  
 the debts I owe are paid off Then I leave to my wife Ginny Worrell all the balance of my pos  
 serty both personal and real but she the said Ginny Worrell is not at liberty to sell the  
 property unless she should need some sole for her support. then she can sell a nuff to  
 support her only & it is understood that the said Ginny Worrell is to have the use of all  
 the property until my son James Worrell arrives to the age of Seventy one years old. At  
 that time then sell property a nuff to come to Seventy dollars and I give the money  
 to William Worrell and one bed and furnature Beddes. also sell property and give over  
 to Mills Worrell the sum of Forty dollars. My son Peter Worrell may keep what  
 I have heretofore given him. My son Richard Worrell may keep what I have heretofore  
 given him. My Daughter Mary St Worrell may keep what I have heretofore given her  
 and nothing else at this time. My Daughter Lucinda Bryant may keep what I have  
 heretofore given her and nothing else at this time. Then after all the legacies are paid  
 off my will is for my son James Worrell to have half of the remaining part of  
 my estate and my wife Ginny Worrell the other half if my wife dies before my son  
 James Worrell arrives to 21 years. Then sell pay off the two legacies and all the balance  
 I give to my son James Worrell or if my wife dies after my son James Worrell come  
 to 21 years old his part is all to be for my son James Worrell I hereby appoint Rich  
 ard Darden my Executor to this my last will revoking all former wills by me made  
 heretofore In witness my hand and seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of June 1838

 This last will and Testament of James Worrell Sr was proved by the oath of James J Darden and  
 Lewis Worrell two of the witnesses thereto and to be recorded. Richard Darden. the Executor therein named  
 appearing in Court and offering to take upon himself the burthen of the execution of the said will and James  
 Worrell the widow making up her right to the administration it was ordered that the estate of the said James  
 Worrell Sr be committed to the hands of James Chespenburg Sheriff of this County for administration  
 according to law
