The Mr. H. Dwyer was employed by the Court after the testator's death to work & in the farm for which
 means this amount was paid. B. This was paid in pursuance of testator's wish after his death and which
 was sold at his sale as L. for fish furnished for support of the family after the testator's death.
 C. The testator states that he recd. this bond in Norfolk in sales of Bacon's sometime before the testator's death
 and as he knew the hand writing, he took no endorsement of the bond; that he had shown it to the testator
 after he recd. it, but that it was never paid. D. Leatham is then the negroes. E. The testator was the
 owner of the Brothers estate and at his death John Denegre administered and this sum was
 paid him, as the balance due said Brothers estate as shown in report. F. John Exum was em-
 ployed to subvert and to take charge of the testator's estate after his death and for his services
 & sundries furnished the family this amount was paid him.
 In reporting the former account to the clerk of the Court I find I was charged April 1832 and
 1832 of sum due as paid Edwin Richs in part of a bond. These sums were in part again
 vacated instead of a bond see 24th 18th 26th 1832 in this account, also the Court's receipts
 filed the Court directs the Court to state that he had made some payments in an account
 in which Robert Murray had obtained against the estate before his former report but as the
 payments were credited on the vacature and he having no separate receipts for the amts
 paid he had forgotten at the time this fact. This error and all the other vouchers alone
 to be filed for the information of the Court - the Court will also remark that at the time
 the former report was made, he was not apprised of the rules which should govern Court
 as laid down in Leigh's reports in relation to the closing the accounts at the end of the
 first year. he has now mended the account as then laid down which makes some
 difference in the result
