In the name of God Amen I Lucy Husband of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being sick of body but of a sound and disposing mind, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit:

It is my will and desire that my Executor hereafter appointed shall at my death sell at public auction all of my personal estate (not herein specifically bequeathed) towards the payment of my just debts.

It is my wish that none of my negroes should be sold but that they may be hired out by my executor from year to year until all of my debts are paid. I also desire that they may be permitted to select their masters provided that their hire meets the approbation of my Executor. It is also my wish that my said William should not be so hired but be disposed of as he may prefer direct Testes.

I give and bequeath to the Baptist Society at the Newbern meeting house sixpence being Twenty Dollars and

I give and bequeath to each of my negroes Twenty five dollars to be paid them at the discharge of my debts.

I give and bequeath to my Nephew William J. Howard three of my horses remaining at my death.
