7th I hereby leave to my friend Peter D. Beckman during his natural life, my negro slave Williams and all the debt of
Peter D. Beckman it is my will and desire that P. negro Williams shall pass to the heirs at law of Peter D. Beckman and
Perigee Beckman of their bodies lawfully begotten

8th It is my will and desire after the payment of my debts that the balance of my estate should be divided into four
parts one of which I bequeath to my sister Sarah Williams and to her and her heirs forever one to the grant children
my brother Benjamin W. Johnson to them and their heirs forever. One to the children of my brother William Johnson
to them and their heirs forever. One to the children of my brother James Johnson, one to the children of my brother
belong Johnson to them and their heirs forever. One to the children of my sister Flowers to them and their heirs
forever and the other to my friend Peter D. Beckman to them and their heirs forever

Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Peter D. Beckman and Robert Ridley Executors to the

At a Court held for the County of Southampton in the 17th day of December 1837

This last will and Testament of Lucy Fournier did was proved by the oath of Thomas Abbott and John O. Heywood
two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Peter D. Beckman one of the Executors
therein named who made oath and together with Spratley Williams and Thomas Ridley Sr. his securities entered into an
acknowledged a bond in the penalty of thirty five thousand dollars conditioned as the said decedent Certificate of
entry did him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form. Robert Ridley the other executor named in the said will
appeared in Court and refused to take upon himself any part of the burdens of the Execution thereof.

will and disposing mind, think proper to make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following
Item 1st I provide my beloved sister Harriet Williams late Widow of Calhoun and her family
Harriet Whitehead should survive me. I give devise and bequeath to her a sum of money sufficient to purchase a
healthy negro girl between the age of fifteen and sixteen years old (should she not survive me) the sum and
of money and for the above purpose; I give and bequeath to Archibald Bond, son of the aforesaid Calhoun and
his. In either event to her or his heirs and assigns forever

Item 2nd The residue of my estate I give devise and bequeath to be equally divided between Elizabeth Foster
and Mary Jane Rockhill Daughters of Clements Rockhill to them and to their heirs and assigns forever

Item 3rd I nominate and appoint my friend Clements Rockhill Executor to this my last will and Testament
revoking all others by me heretofore made: declaring this and no other to be my last will and Testament
Given under my hand and seal this 21st day of August 1838
