 was returned and ordered to lie over for exceptions. And at a court held for the said County on the 20<sup>th</sup>  
 day of May 1839 the said account having lain over for over and no exceptions being filed was confirmed  
 and ordered to be Recorded.

Now I am appointed by the Almighty in his wisdom for man to die and being somed  
 I have disposed thoughts in perfect mind and memory have thought proper to make the following dis-  
 posals of my property (to wit) First I leave to my wife Elizabeth Branch the tract of  
 land purchased of Edwin Morris until my son John N. Branch shall arrive to the age of twenty  
 one and then to him and his heirs forever I also leave to my wife the following negroes Sam  
 Harrison butler and slave until my son John N. Branch shall arrive to the age of twenty  
 one and then to be equally divided between my three children namely Virginia Branch  
 Louisiana Branch and John N. Branch I also give to my Daughter Virginia Branch a negro  
 woman Jane and four children whose names are Lewis, Emily, Ben and Dorothy all of whom  
 increase I give to Daughter Virginia and her heirs forever I also give to my Daughter  
 Louisiana a negro woman Sally and three children whose names are Eliza, Tom and  
 the younger a boy unnamed and as before all of whose increase I give to my Daughter  
 Louisiana and her heirs forever I also give to my son John N. Branch a negro woman  
 Abby and three children whose names are Candie, Nelly and Jacob and their increase  
 also to my son John N. Branch and his heirs forever It is furthermore my will and  
 desire that my Executor John H. Booth shall sell all the lands not herein named with  
 the proceeds arising from such sale pay all my just debts and the remainder if any  
 to be equally divided among my three children above named hereby revoking all  
 former wills and testaments by me made in Writing whereof I have hereunto set my  
 hand and seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of March 1839
