

natural life or widowhood with and upon the following conditions nevertheless that my wife shall furnish and pay over into the hands of my executors or to a Guardian to my child Ethelia Virginia Barnes a sum that will be sufficient to educate the said Ethelia Virginia at one of the best female seminaries in various branches of learning usually taught from also the ornamental branches (viz, Music, painting, &c) and further should my wife marry in that event it is my will that she forget the above said and be innamored only just to her thoughts of my estate

3rd At the death or marriage of my wife Priscilla if my child Ethelia Virginia be alive and shall arrive to the age of twenty one years or marries I give and bequeath unto her my Daughter Ethelia M Barnes the whole of the estate of every description which I have bequeathed to my wife unto her the said Ethelia M and her heirs forever: but if the said Ethelia M should be dead at the time above noted or should thereafter die before she arrives to the age of twenty one years or marries in that event I give and bequeath unto my wife and to her heirs forever the following negro slaves by name Jims Henry Morris and her children Barbara Rodrick Evelyn and Maria and Lincy and future increase they being the negroes owned by her when we were married also all monies and estates which I may have received by virtue of said marriage unto her and her heirs forever: also in said event I further give and bequeath unto my sisters Mary Elizabeth Eliza and Sarah Ann Porter unto them and their heirs forever to be equally divided between them: the following property to wit: the negroed slaves which I owned before I was married to wit by name Susan Susan Sarah and Jimm and their future increase also my Int and the dower negroes in possession of my Mother held as such from the Est of my Father with their future increase and all other estate which may belong to me which I may not heretofore disposed off unto them and their and each of their heirs forever

4th And lastly I hereby appoint my friends John M Gentry and Peter Edwards Executors to this my last will and testament: hereby revoking all other will by me made. As Witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22^d day of July in the year of our Lord 1839

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 16th day of September 1839

The last will and Testament of John H Barnes deceased was proved by the oath of William L Corvill and William R Robinson two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and caused to be Recorded. Peter Edwards one of the executors therein named appeared in Court and refused to take upon himself the execution thereof. On the motion of John M Gentry the other executor therein named who came with and together with Nathaniel J Williams and Henry M Dault his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form
