I, Stephen Munday of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being in perfect health, of disposing memory and sound mind, doth make and utter this my last will and Testament, revoking and utterly disallowing all others heretofore made. Now, I give and bequeath to my wife Rebecca Munday and her heirs forever all my estate both real and personal consisting of a tract of land situate and being in the County of Hampton it being the plantation formerly owned by Griffin With of said County to myself by Alexander P. Poole for further particulars of said tract of Land see Bond from Poole to me also two negro men Holland & Caesar also twenty five hundred dollars in the United States Bank in the borough of Norfolk. Also twelve hundred dollars in bonds & accounts left in the care of my wife also my crop of corn fodder & peas household & kitchen furniture plantation utensils stock of Horses cattle Hogs and sheep, reserving out of the said enumerated property enough to pay all my just debts. I appoint and constitute to this my last will and Testament my wife Rebecca Munday & James D. Maffenburg as Executor & Co-executors. Given under my hand & seal in the borough of Norfolk September 23rd 1831
