This last Will and Testament of James Taylor deceased was proved by the oath of George Williams and Charles E. B. Bonds two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of Barton Taylor one of the executors therein named who made oath and together with John Burdett Nathan B. Boyd and Henry Jones and Warner W. Cloud his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form liberty being reserved for the other executor therein named to be joined in the same when he thinks fit
