

diminished persons also one third of the Contents of my Buffet my silver Table spoons my glass and Horns of wine
as much money or good bonds as will make her equal with my grand children having after named I also
give her my winter setting Chairs. 2ndly I give to my grand son James Woodward Harwood one third
of the Contents of my Buffet also my silver Table spoons and one half my plantations lying on the Notchaway
River at Valuation and as much Money or good bonds as will make her equal with Elizabeth.

3rdly I give and bequeath to my grand son Thomas Jefferson Harwood the remaining third of the contents
of my Buffet also the Buffet one half dozen silver spoons One pair Chest the remaining one half of my
plantation lying on the Notchaway River aforesaid at Valuation also as much Money or good bonds as will
make her equal with Elizabeth and James my first being to make my said grand children all
equal if in case however either one or more should die before arriving to the age of twenty one years
my wish and desire is that there shall survive have all my estate.

2dly all the residue of my estate not herein particularly disposed of I wish to be equally divided
between my said Grand Children all which I give and bequeath to them and their heirs forever.

5thly should all my said grand children die before they come of age or marry my will and desire
that my said Burkland Wrenn have the whole of my estate and further more I wish my said son take a
third money and bonds into his possession that I may leave at the time of my death and to pay
an interest thereon until Elizabeth should come of age or marry, and then to pay over to her her
proportion likewise when James arrives to the age of twenty one years to pay over to him his
proportion of money or bonds and have the plantations Valued by three disinterested persons and
one for him to have proportion of his part thereof and for her to do the same by Thomas
when he comes to the age of twenty one, and if either James or Thomas should die before the age of
twenty one years for the living one to have the whole of the land. And Lastly I hereby constitute
and appoint my said Burkland Wrenn executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking
all other or former Wills or Testaments by me hitherto made. In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this eighth day of May 1833

The last will and Testament of Sally Wrenn doz was proved by the oaths of Joseph Blanton and William
H. Digricks the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Burkland
Wrenn the Executor therein named who made oath and together with Joseph Blanton and Henry
Pitman his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five Thousand
dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof on due proofs
