

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20th day of July 1840
 This last Will and Testament of Willie Francis decd. was proved by the oath of Henry Green and
 Samuel B. Woodard two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded: And on the
 motion of Howell Harris one of the executors therein named who made oath and together with
 William A. Thomas and Richard Porter his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond
 in the penalty of thirty thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs Certificate is granted
 him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form likely being reserved to the other executors therein
 named to be joined in the said probat when they think fit.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20th day of July 1840
 The report of the appraisers appointed to appraise the estate of Joseph Harris decd. was returned and ordered

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 18th day of May 1840
 On the motion of Richard Drury and Marions his wife to establish the Municipative Will of Asahel
 Signed deceased - the Summons awarded at the Court against Sula signed the widow of the said
 Asahel signed being executed - This day came as with the said Richard Drury and Marions his wife
 as the said Sula Jeyner by their attorneys and thereupon Henry Bousard and Horat Drury being
 sworn severally deposed that on Thursday Morning the 13th day of April last past Asahel
 Jeyner at the house of Albert Bradshaw that being his place of residence and had been for some
 months past - and about six or eight hours before his death and while in his perfect senses
 remarked that he had not made any will because he did not think he was going to die but he said
 in the event of his death that he gave the whole of his estate to his sister Marions Drury the wife of
 Richard Drury - And other witnesses were sworn and examined and the said Richard Drury, Henry
 and Sula Jeyner by their Counsel full heard - The Court after hearing the testimony and upon
 due consideration thereof doth establish the foregoing statements and declarations of the said Henry
 Bousard and Horat Drury as the Municipative will of the said Asahel Jeyner decd. and orders that
 it be recorded - From which opinions and decisions of the Court the said Sula Jeyner prays and
 appeal to the next Court Superior Court of Law and Chancery to be held for this County which is
 granted her upon her executing bond with good security in the State Office in the penalty of \$100
 dollars conditioned as the Law directs within one month from this time.
