Brookman and James Drury his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration of the said Benjamin Phipps estate with his will annexed in due form.

1st Item: I leave to my wife during her life all of my estate reserving a sufficiency to pay all of my just debts. 2nd Item: My wish and desire is that at the death of my wife that my children Susan and Benjamin have my estate: 3rd Item: Should my children aforesaid die before my wife then at her death I give and bequeath the said property to my Brothers Leeson Barham and William Barham (equally divided) to them and their heirs forever: 4th Item: In consideration of the above bequeath to my wife it is my will and desire for her to maintain my children.

5th Item: I hereby appoint my wife executrix to this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22nd day of November year one thousand eight hundred and Forty
