I Stephen Allen The Orator of Good Love: I Samuel Nepherson of the County of Southampton  
Will and parish of Orkney being in perfect health at present do make and declare this to be my last  
will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. Now: I give and bequeath unto my  
beloved wife Polly Nepherson all my land and plantation whereof I now live containing  
by estimation thirty eight and a half acres be the same more or less two further beds and  
furniture all of my stock of horses cattle dogs sheep and plantation Utensils to her  
and her heirs forever. And lastly I do appoint my wife Polly Nepherson to be my whole  
and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament discharging and making void all  
other wills by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1841.
