In the name of God Alme I Kinchen Jynor of Southampton County Virginia being in
 full perfect sense and memory do make this my last will and Testament to wch I leave unto my
 beloved wife Aggy all the profits and emoluments of my real and personal estate during her
 life but after her death I devise it in the following manner (1st) I give and bequeath
 unto my daughter Polly any dwelling house and part of my plantation (viz) beginning at
 a Spruce fence or corner in the line of James Great Thorne's line to Basing road
 and up said Road to the Boring church land and by said church lands to a red oak at
 corner in Joseph Prestons line from Thorne's a straight line to the first station with the
 privilege of getting fire wood and cut timber from my pecoson lands also one feather
 bed and furniture One Lovend and gear One Blue Chest and one pine Table to her and
 to her heirs and upyng forever. (2^d) I give and bequeath unto my son William
 Beyond the remainder of my land with the exception of the aforementioned privilege
 to my daughter Polly. (3^r) I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my son Joshua
 Before the sum of one dollar each to them and their heirs or upyng forever.
 Lastly I wife Aggy to be my sole Executrix and after satisfying all my just debts
 to keep the remainder of my estate during her life and after her death to be equally
 divided between my aforesaid son and daughter William and Polly. Given under
 my hand and seal this 11th day of April One thousand eight hundred and forty
 six

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 15th day of April 1841
 The last will and Testament of Kinchen Jynor deceased was proved by the oaths of Elijah
 Jynor and Jancy Jynor two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be Record
 and Aggy Jynor the executrix theron named refused to take upon herself the burden
 of the execution thereof. On motion of William Jynor who made oath together
 with Polly Jynor Edmund Turner and Jancy Jynor his decedent's widow into and where
 whereof a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs interpret
 is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Kinchen Jynor
 with his said will annexed in one form.
