I signed in the name of John James J. Hinchey of Southampton County Virginia being in
 full perfect sense and memory do make this my last will and Testament to wit: I leave unto my
 beloved wife Aggy all the profits and emoluments of my real and personal estate during her
 life but after her death I devise it in the following manner (1st) I give and bequeath
 unto my daughter Polly my dwelling house and part of my plantation (viz) beginning at
 a square pole a corner in the line of James Gods Chance Gods line to Brazins road
 and up said Road to the Cherry Church land and by said Church land to a red Oak a
 corner in Joseph Potters line from thence a straight line to the first station with the
 privilege of getting fire wood and coal Timber from my pasture Land also one feather
 bed and furniture One second and good one Blue Chest and one pine Table to her and
 to her heirs and assigns forever. (2^d) I give and bequeath unto my son William
 Jeynes the remainder of my land with the exception of the aforementioned premises
 to my daughter Polly. (3^d) I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my son Joshua
 Jeynes the sum of one dollar each to them and their heirs or assigns forever.
 Lastly, I wife Aggy to be my sole executrix and after satisfying all my just debts
 to keep the remainder of my estate during her life and after her death to be equally
 divided between my aforementioned son and daughter William and Polly. Given under
 my hand and seal this 11th day of April One thousand eight hundred and thirty
 six

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 19th day of April 1841
 The last will and Testament of Hinchey Jeynes deceased was proved by the oath of Elijah
 Jeynes and James Jeynes two of the subscribing witnesses Thence and ordered to be heard
 and Aggy Jeynes the executrix Thence named refused to take upon herself the burden
 of the execution thereof. On motion of William Jeynes who made oath and together
 with Polly Jeynes Edward James and James Jeynes his depositions entered into and returned
 whereby a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars (conditioned as the law therein requires)
 is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Hinchey Jeynes
 with this said will annexed in due form.
