

Finally I give and bequeath to my negro woman Esther, her freedom and wish to be removed with her children above named to a more slave holding State or Territory and my
 do negro woman Sally I wish to be comfortably supported as long as she lives and not to be
 Compelled to labour for any person whatsoever, only as she pleases - Fifthly I hereby nomi-
 nate and appoint John of Prince of Sages being V.th and John W. Watkins of the State
 of Ohio (of Ohio) Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other or
 former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made and this only is to be taken to carry
 out. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of October

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 21st day of June 1832

This writing purporting to be the last will and Testament and Codicil thereto of Joseph Blanton dec.
 was produced in Court by John of Prince One of the Executors therein named and there being but
 one subscribing witness thereto Solomon D. Parker and James E. Peters being sworn severally
 depose and said that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Joseph Blanton
 and verily believe that the body of the said will and Codicil as well as the signature of
 the said Joseph Blanton thereto to be wholly in the hand writing of the said Joseph Blanton
 whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be Recorded as and for the last will and Testa-
 ment and Codicil thereto of the said Joseph Blanton dec. And ord the motion of John of
 Prince who made oath and together with Solomon D. Parker and James E. Peters his oth-
 -erwise entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of thirty thousand dollars
 Conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said
 will in due form liberty being reserved for the other Executors to be joined in the said
 probate when he thinks fit -
