On the name of God Amen. I James Stephenson - of the County of Southampton
and State of Virginia being awake in body but of sound mind and memory think
be to you for the same. I do now think proper to make this paper writing
as and for my last will and Testament in manner and form following (Vizt),
Item - My Will and desire is that all my just debts and funeral expences be
paid - Item I give unto my beloved wife Caroline Stephenson one feather bed
and furniture and one trunk to her and her heirs forever -

Item - I give and bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Richard Stephenson
one feather bed and furniture one silver watch one gun and all my books of
Every kind whatsoever to him and his heirs forever -

Item - I give and bequeath unto my wife Caroline one third of all my Estate of every
kind whatsoever as well that - that is owing to me as my other property that is not
heretofore disposed of to her and her heirs forever -

Item - I give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel R. Stephenson the other two thirds
of my estate including what is due and owing to me and of Every kind whatsoever to
him and his heirs forever -

Lastly - I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friend Richard Milner
as my whole and sole Executor to see my last will and Testament revoking all
other will heretofore by me made - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
affixed my Seal this 28th day of November 1841
