lived together with all their future increase, to her and her heirs for ever I leave to my wife, three  
hundred acres of land to be said off nearest adjoining the house. I now live in during her life.  
Margarett & Barrett's life or widowhood I give to my wife the first choice of my kids the first  
choice of my house & furnish out 1 table 2 beds & piping of two hundred dollars Cash or bonds to her  
of her heirs forever.

3<sup>rd</sup> Item I give to my Son William & Barrett the tract of land called the old place & the best  
of land called the Jackson tract in case either of my children should die leaving no male  
I give their portion to the surviving or survivor

4<sup>th</sup> Item I give to my Son Benjamin & Barrett all the balance of my lands say the home house  
with all my other lands not disposed of here & now and in case he should die not leaving a male  
I give them to my other children or their lawful spouse.

5<sup>th</sup> Item I give to my Daughter Catharine C. & Barrett fifteen hundred dollars to make  
her equal with my sons as to the land I give them.

My Will and desire is that my negro man Jacob be hired out until he shall pay to my estate  
four hundred dollars with interest thereon from my death & then be free.

My Will and desire is that my negro man George be hired out until he pay to my estate  
two hundred dollars with interest thereon from my death & then be free.

My Will and desire is that my negro man Edmund be hired out until he pay to my estate  
three hundred dollars & interest thereon from my death & then be free.

All the balance of my estate I give to be equally divided between my three children and  
should either of them die not leaving a male I give them to the survivor or survivor.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 21<sup>st</sup> day of November 1842  
The last will and Testament of John Barrett deceased was proved by the oaths of Alexander  
Myrick, Richard R. Ferguson and Josiah Horrell the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be  
Recorded, there being no Executor named in said Will. On the Motion of James Mayot who on oath  
together with Eliza Rochelle, Alexander Myrick and Davis Boy and his Surety entered  
into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Thirty Thousand dollars conditioned as to  
law directs. Certificate is granted the said Mayot for obtaining letters of administration  
on the said decedent's Estate with his will aforesaid annexed in due form.
