I Now all men by these presents that I James Whithead of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia being of both sound mind and memory
do hereby make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner
and form as follows - To wit

1st It is my Will and desire that all my just debts should be paid.
2nd To my son Elliott Whithead I give and bequeath the sum of forty
six dollars and ninety five cents over and above the proportion which may
accuse to him from a subsequent division of my effects -

3rd To my daughter Elizabeth Whithead I in like manner give and
bequeath one feather bed.

4th And lastly It is my will and desire that my wife Elizabeth Whithead
shall have and hold my entire estate goods and chattels during her life a
widow and that no sale of my property goods or chattels to be made till after
the decease of the said Elizabeth Whithead after which I desire a fair
sale and a just & equal division of all the proceeds arising from such
sale (after Elliott Whithead and Elizabeth Whithead shall have received
their entire portions according to the 1st & 2nd articles of my will) then
an equal division of the residue between all of my lawful heirs. I also do
hereby appoint and ordain my wife Elizabeth Whithead and my son Henry
Whithead executors of this my last Will and Testament.
