Item 2nd I give to my three daughters Suzetta Estey, Maria Sanaor and Almira Ribba Sanaor five dollars each to them & their heirs forever.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my wife Jane the remaining part of my estate after paying my just debts and the legacies above named, both real and personal to her and her heirs forever.

And lastly I do constitute and appoint my wife Jane Executor to this my last will and Testament.

Rich. W. Williams
Will

In the name of God Amen I Richard W. Williams of the County of Southampton of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and constitute this my last will and Testament in manner and form following:

Item 1st I desire that all my just debts be paid.

Item 2nd for the purpose of paying my debts, it is my will and desire that my Executor shall break up my plantation, and sell the crop, stock, plantation utensils, and household and other furniture on such terms and any other best.

Item 3rd It is my will and desire that my executor do sell all my lands or such tenements, and in such mode of selling it or by dividing it into smaller tracts, as he may deem most advantageous for my estate and the deficiency if any in paying my debt from the sale of my perishable property and money do not, I wish made up out of such sale of my lands. I also direct that a portion sufficient to pay to my wife Jane the legacy given her by my dear brother Joseph, shall be invested in state stock or placed in some other safe mode.

Item 4th I direct that my negro woman Fanny and child be sold and that my executor sell my other property and my dear best.

Item 5th I give to my beloved wife Caroline, for her use during her life one third of my negroes and one third of the interest which may annually accrue from any monies which may belong to my estate after payment of debts and the balance herein directed, in lieu of the right of dower in my estate.

Item 6th I give to my two children all the rest of my estate with the reversion of the property given to my wife.
