 2^d I give and bequeath to my uncle Samuel H. Holmes my negro man Sam Little Edward Clarke Sermons, the Psalms for die of Religious Knowledge, watch and three hundred and fifty
 3^d I give and bequeath to Reuben Jones my Latin and Greek Books, and to my uncle Samuel H. Holmes the balance of my library.
 4th I give and bequeath the remainder of my estate to my uncle Samuel H. Holmes.
 5th I also nominate and ordain my uncle Samuel H. Holmes my whole and sole executor of my last will and testament, and that all others of this kind are void.
 Given under my hand and seal the twenty fourth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and forty three.
