Diligent: being in bad health and knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die  
and being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my last will  
and testament in manner and form as follows to wit:

Item the first my will is that all my just debts should be paid;

Item the second: I leave all the balance of my estate after my just debts is paid both  
real and personal to my beloved wife Lucy P. Drew during her natural life for the  
purpose of raising and schooling my younger children: after the death of my wife Lucy  
P. Drew: I leave to the heirs of Mary L. Jordan formerly Mary L. Drew the sum of  
Three hundred dollars to be equally divided between her several children;

Item the third I give to my daughter Dorcas Barn Maithew formerly Dorcas Barn  
the sum of Eight hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever;

Item the fourth after the death of my wife Lucy P. Drew: my will and desire is that  
all my estate both real and personal be sold and equally divided between my four  
children namely: James D. Drew: Wm. H. Drew: Nevil Drew Edward J. Drew  
Lucy E. Drew: Ponson V. Drew: Priscilla J. Drew and to my child unknown to them all  
their heirs forever: Lastly my will and desire is that my beloved wife Lucy P. Drew  
should be my Executor and that she be suffered to qualify without security and  
in case she should be unwilling to qualify after mature consideration: then my will  
that Henry Moore should be my Executor: In witness whereof I have written  
my hand and seal this fourth day of November One thousand eight hundred and  
forty three.
