First I Give and bequeath to the Children of my son James Searbrough dec Namely Robert Searbrough Julia Searbrough Caroline Searbrough and James Searbrough one Shilling each forevermore which they have in possession, also I Give to each of them Five Dollars to them and their heirs forever

Second I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Julia Searbrough one Loom to her and her heirs forever

Third I Give to my Daughters Not Married or those which has Not been Married as long as they May live single all my houses and Thirty acres of Land around the same so as they May have at home until they Marry or die

4<sup>th</sup> I Give to my son John Searbrough the residue of my Land during his life after his death I bequeath the said Land to his eldest son Named William Searbrough If William should die before he arrives to the age of 21 years or without lawful issue I Give the said Land to my Daughters Nancy, Julia Martha, and Elly Searbrough -

5<sup>th</sup> after the death or Marriage of all my Daughters Now remaining single I Give to my son John during his life the houses and 30 Land heretofore Mentioned and loaned to my Daughters - after his death I Give the said Land to his said son William Searbrough if William should die before he arrives to the age of 21 Years or die without lawful issue I Give the said Land to my Daughters Nancy, Julia Martha and Elly Searbrough

6<sup>th</sup> I Give and bequeath to my Sonne Daughter Martha Searbrough Five Dollars to her and her heirs forever

7<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire at my death that all my Estate Not Given away should be sold in a Credit of Twelve Months on good security and proceeds of such sales after paying my just debts to be equally divided between my children Namely Nancy Searbrough Julia Searbrough Elly Searbrough and the children of Sally Basset that May be living at my death to each one Fourth of the Net proceeds of said sale
