In The Name of God Amen I Joseph T. Cloud of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of sound and disposing mind and Memory do make and constitute this as and for my last will and Testament

Supimus: after the payment of all my just Debts and funeral expenses It is my will and desire that all my Estate real and personal shall be kept together and managed as now arranged into farms and plantations and managed by my Executors hereinafter named until my son Joseph T. Cloud attains lawful age for the support and education of my younger children and that of my wife and children as one family. The surplus of the profits of the plantations and the interest of Monies belonging to my Estate after a liberal support for the family and giving my children a good education to fall in and form a portion of my undivided Estate

Now on the Marriage of either of my Daughters including my Daughter Elizabeth B. who is now married It is my will that such Daughter shall take a child share of all my Negro slaves except those specially bequeathed Counting my wife as a child that is to say if at the happening of that event there be seven children living I give to each of my Daughters so Marrying one eighth part of my Negroes and so if there be a greater or smaller Number I also give to my Daughter Elizabeth B. a Negro Girl named Mariah and to my Daughter Martha a Negro
