I make and ordain this my last will and Testaments

Two cups and saucers one Tobe of each two horses four heads of sheep one silver bowl one Bopal one pair of best wools first choice and Negro man Silbott's son  
 3<sup>d</sup> I Give at the death of my Daughter Caroline Drakes to my two grand Daughters Emily Angale Drakes & Mary Caroline Drakes Negro man Silbott to them & their heirs forever at the death of my Daughter Caroline I wish the property leased her sole except Negro man Silbott and equally divided between my Grand children their living  
 4<sup>th</sup> I Give and bequeath to my two Grand sons David Sumner Drakes and Francis William Drakes two beds second third choice & furniture to them & their heirs forever  
 5<sup>th</sup> I Give and bequeath to my Grand son John Henry Drakes one bed and furniture first choice to him and his heirs forever  
 6<sup>th</sup> I Give and bequeath to my Grand Daughters Emily Angale Drakes & Mary Caroline Drakes two beds & furniture to them and their heirs forever fifth & sixth choice  
 7<sup>th</sup> All the Property that I have not disposed of above I wish sold and after all my debts are paid I want the balance equally divided between my Grand children I also appoint Richard Barrett my Executor Several under my hand and seal the eighteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty four.

This Last will and Testament of Byrd Sumner as foreword by the oath of Richard Barrett & Nancy Doyal two of the subscribing Witnesses and ordered to be Recorded. Richard Barrett the executor therein named refusing to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof It is ordered that the estate of the said Byrd Sumner be committed to the hands of Maxwell B. Harris Sheriff of the County for administration according to law.
