

of Giv^r and bequeath to my son William H. Griffon one thousand dollars in addition to what I have heretofore given him (which is about six hundred dollars) to him heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Robert J. Griffon one hundred Dollars to be spent exclusive to him and his heirs forever.

Slaves of two and bequeath unto my other three sons. Namely, Gordon & Griffon, drawn Griffon and Bay & Franklin Griffon all the rest of my Estates that has not been especially given to them with what I have left to my wife (for them to have at her death) to be equally divided between them taking into consideration two hundred and fifty dollars which I have advanced to Gordon and one hundred & thirty dollars which I have advanced to Griffon while I have advanced nothing to Benjamin Franklin this division I wish to be made by each of them choosing either @ piece and for them to take the property at the valuation not to consider the land etc but in parts and the other to take of other property to make them equal in amount but if they have advance to Gordon & Griffon then in that event I wish my son William Henry Griffon to have equally with Gordon & Benjamin Franklin in the surplus according to what is stated above and also my daughter Mary White to share with the four sons above named in the surplus which may remain after Gordon & Benjamin have had their thousand dollars each and should there be any thing to Mary White agreeable to the above clause of this it to remain in the hands of my Executor herein after named and dealt out to her or her children as she may desire her. Lastly I do hereby nominate Constitute and my two sons Gordon & Robert J. Griffon my whols and sole executors to this my last will and Testament involving all other will heretofore made for writing whereof the said Benjamin Griffon has hereunto set his hand and affixed my seal this 20 day of March 1844.

Griffon one of the Executors herein named who made oath and together with Edwards Babb Willis Bradshaw his attorney advised and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs before it is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form. Liberty being reserved for other Executor to be found in the said probate where he thinks fit.
