1st I declare that all my Just, debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executors here after named out of my Estate

2nd I Give to my Daughter Polly Ferguson all my property now in her possession and that which I purchased at the sale of John Ferguson dec'd to her and her heirs forever

3rd I also give to my said daughter Polly Ferguson the sum of Eighty five dollars enable her to pay Thomas B. Merrill for the tract of land whereon she now resides

4th I Give to my said Daughter Polly Ferguson one third part of the balance of my Estate to her and her heirs forever I also give to my son William S. Wilson one third part of the said balance of my Estate to him and his heirs forever I also give to my grand children Rebecca Jones & Martha Ellen Wilson infants children of John Wilson dec'd one third part of the said balance of my Estate, but in case either of them should die without only a lawfully begotten heir of her own body I Give her third of said Estate
