Wigham one of the Executors therein named who made oath and together with Andrew B. Wigham his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs to give a guarantee him of the validity of said will in due form shortly being removed for the Executor to be joined in said probate when he thinks fit

Item The Name of God amen I Henry Humphrey Diving of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia do make and publish this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say
 Item 1st I have unto my daughter Susan Jones during her Natural life and after her death Named Hanna which Negro she has in her possession and at her death the said Negro to be sold and the money arising from the sale thereof to be equally divided between her children or their descendants such descendants taking only the share or shares to which their said parent or parents respectively would if living been entitled to to have and to hold the same forever

Item 2nd I Give unto my Daughter Nancy Holth one Negro woman Named Mary and her increase which woman she has in her possession to her and her heirs forever
 Item 3rd I Give unto my son William Henry Robinson one Negro woman Named Betsy which woman bely he took possession of some years ago and conveyed her to the said William one hundred and ten pounds two shillings on my books against my son William Henry Robinson which it is my will that he shall not pay but it is my will and desire that the sum of one hundred and ten pounds two shillings (without interest) shall be deducted from the amount which may be allotted from my estate for his children's children of my daughter Francis S Robinson which amount to be applied to my other estate for distribution amongst my other legates

Item 4th I Give unto my son Humphrey Diving two Negroes to wit one named Sam and one named Cynthia which Negroes I have put in the possession to him and his heirs forever
