 Thirdly After the death of my wife Elizabeth I bequeath out of the above  
 property but to my Wife One hundred dollars to my Grand daughter  
 Ann Eliza Cobb to her and her heirs forever.  
 Fourthly I bequeath out of the above mentioned property but to my wife  
 after her death three hundred dollars to each of my children except  
 Lancaster R. Gardner & Percival Gardner. Comprising Caroline Esqr. Cobb  
 & Geo. W. Gardner to them and their heirs forever.  
 Fifthly I bequeath after the death of my beloved wife out of the property but  
 her One hundred dollars in the hands of my son Geo. W. Gardner to be applied as  
 he may think proper for the benefit of Percival Gardner.  
 Sixthly If there should be more property after the death of my wife Elizabeth  
 than will pay the above bequests I shall direct the balance to be equally  
 divided among my children Lancaster R. Gardner Percival Gardner Comprising  
 Caroline Esqr. Cobb and Geo. W. Gardner It is not my intention to give to my  
 son Lancaster R. Gardner any of my estate unless there should be more
