 1836 this Last Will and Testament of Temporarily Bryant was and proved
 by the oath of W. H. Bryant and Persilla Bryant also subscribing Witnesses there
 and Ordered to be Recorded and the Motion of James O. Bryant
 that Receiver therein named, who made oath and together with H. Napier
 and John W. Worrell his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in
 the penalty of One thousand Dollars conditioned as the Law directs, certificate
 is granted him for obtaining the probate of said Will in due form.

In the Name of God Amen I Aaron S. Baker Carden of Southampton
 Co. Va. being weak in body but of sound mind do make and ordain this
 my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following (Viz)
 First I give unto my son Geo. W. Carden the tract of Land whereon I
 now reside to him and his heirs forever.
 Secondly I send unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Carden during her natural
 life all my negroes stock and chattel estate and in fact all my estate
 of every kind and sort whatsoever for her own use and benefit.
 Thirdly After the death of my wife Elizabeth I give out of the above
 property but to my wife One hundred dollars to my Grand daughter
 Ann Eliza Cobb to her and her heirs forever.
 Fourthly I give out of the above mentioned property but to my wife
 after her death three hundred dollars to each of my children except
 Randolph R. Carden viz Persilla Carden Temporarily Carden Saml Cobb
 & Geo W Carden to them and their heirs forever.
 Fifthly I leave after the death of my beloved wife out of the property but
 her One hundred dollars in the hands of my son Geo W Carden to be applied as
 he may think proper for the benefit of Persilla Carden.
 Sixthly Of there should be more property after the death of my wife Elizabeth
 there will pay the above negroes I shall have the balance to be equally
 divided among my children Randolph R Carden Persilla Carden Temporarily
 Carden Saml Cobb and Geo W Carden It is not my intention to give to my
 son Randolph R Carden any of my estate unless there should be more
