estate of whatever nature or kind it may be or consist of (which I have heretofore
given away or disposing of in this Will) I Give the same to him and his heirs
forever
5th I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Joseph W Hart my whole
and sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament Ever Witnessed whereof
I have heretofore set my hand and affixed my seal this 25th day of March
eighteen hundred and forty four
