the surviving children of my daughter Delia Scarborough to them and their
heirs forever

Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my two sons Richard Hines and
John Hines Executors of this my last Will and Testament And Testimony
whereof I have herunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 15 day
of November One thousand eight hundred and forty five
