Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph & Branch the following slaves to wit: Isaac, Jerry, Billy, Eddie, John, Hill, Bob, Sam, Bent, Mack, or Albert Edmund, Edmund, Marcella, Penny, Miles, Nihel, Sart, Sam, Mahima, Howard, Lewis, Clement, Frank, Charity, Mahimah, Berry, Davis and Carter also the slaves known to my wife during her natural life or widowhood from and their increase to him and his heirs forever. Also the land on the south side of Mahima river until other slaves property bequeathed to my said wife either at her death or marriage I have and my said son to him and his heirs forever my Tenant fully and Simon has got two lots furnished.

Item 6th My will and desire is for my son Joseph & Branch should continue at school until he arrives to the age of twenty one years then remain with and take care of his brother and in case my said son Joseph & Branch should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years I hereby give it discretion with him to make a will leave all the property given him to any person or persons he may think proper. Item 7th my will and desire is for the vigorous debt and given to my wife and the vigorous given to my son Joseph & Branch should remain on the plantation or a sufficient to make him @ general support and that balance to be divided out for their joint benefit until my said son arrives to the age of twenty one years.

Item 8th I give and bequeath unto my son John & Branch the balance of my estate both real and personal to him and his heirs forever.

Sasby: I nominate and appoint my respected friends James W. Jordan and Henry W. Terry my Executors to this my last will and testament hereby making all others: Mr. Wm. W. Wherry of I have set my hand and seal the 13th day of my eighteenth hundred and forty six.
