 named who made oath and together with Sarah B. Kello and one J. H. Kelling his
 friends entered into and acknowledged @ bond in the penalty of one hundred dollars
 conditioned as the Law directs Certificate is granted here for obtaining @ probate of said
 Will in due form

This last Will and Testament of Mrs. Nicholas M. Debell in substance runs as
 follows made this day March 6th 1848

- 1st To my beloved wife Margaret & Debell I will & bequeath unto all my estate
 during her widowhood except my gold watch and silver spoons & do not wish any
 sale either of my land or negroes nor of my chattel estate farther than may be
 necessary for the payment of my just debts or of such chattel property as will
 be of the service to my wife & which she may designate
- 2nd The event of her marriage I wish her to have all the property which I got by
 her together with all share of my estate during her life
- 3rd To my brother William I give my gold watch during his life & as he thinks fit
 his son James
- 4th I give to my nephews James & Nicholas Dringocher five hundred dollars
 a piece & if both should die before their mother the above named amount goes to her
 other mother
- 5th My estate is then to be divided into five equal parts and my brother James
 two sons are to have two fifths and my brother Williams three sons are to have
 three fifths and each of them having equal parts
- 6th As my brother James Debell I give my silver spoons and if he were to
 any thing it is my Will that my executor should not exact it of him
- I appoint my brother William & Debell my sole executor without giving security
 signed & subscribed in presence of
