In the Name of God Amen I William D. Drury of the County of Dinwiddie and State of Virginia being weak of body but of sound and disposing mind thanks be to providence do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament wishing all others heretofore made by me:

Item I Give my wife Elizabeth D. Drury during her Natural life all my household and kitchen furniture all my plantation and farming utensils my Carriage and horses my stock of horses cattle and hogs the stock of provisions on hand and also the following Negro Slaves namely: old Ben and his wife Phillis and her child Jeff the Jeff Nell Rosella Mary and her Grand children Georgeanna Hall Mary the Carpenter and his wife Phillis Maria and her children Albert and Margaret Peggy and Malinda: my said wife to have and to hold the said property above named during her Natural life: and at her death the said property to be equally divided among my children or their descendants.

Item I Give my wife Elizabeth D. Drury during her Natural life my plantation in the County of Southampton whereon I lately resided: lying and being on the South side of the three creeks: to have hold and enjoy the said plantation during her Natural life: and at her death I Give the said plantation to my son Benjamin D. Drury to him and his heirs forever.

Item I Give to my son Benjamin D. Drury all my interest in the stock of goods and credits in the Mercantile firm of Hall, Brent & Company of which Mercantile firm I am a partner.

Item I Give my son William Stephen Drury my plantation and tract of land situate and being in the County of Brunswick known as the Black plantation to him and his heirs forever.

Item It is my Will and desire that my Executors herein after named shall when they deem it best and most advantageous sell and dispose of all my lands and undivided interest in lands situate lying and being in the State of Texas and Mississippi and equally divide the moneys arising from such sales of said
