

lands among my daughters or their descendants: In the event in such case shall be made by my (Executor) that it is my Will and desire that my Lands in said State of Texas and Mississippi shall be equally divided among my daughters or their descendants.  
 Item: It is my Will and desire that my lands lying on the North side of the Texas Creek in the County of Southampton: be sold by my Executors hereafter named and the proceeds arising from the sale of be equally divided among my daughters or their descendants.  
 Item: The net and of my estate of whatever nature not herebefore expressed and disposed of I give and bequeath to my children to be equally divided among them.  
 Item: It is my Will and desire that my Executors hereafter named shall collect all debts due me and shall at once pay and discharge all debts due by me.

Item: I leave to my wife Elizabeth H. Godwyn the use of all Slaves that may be allotted in the division of my Slaves to my daughter Sally, Emily and Priscilla Lewis: My said wife to hold the said Slaves until my said daughter shall arrive at the age of eighteen years or more: Upon Condition however that my wife shall educate, raise maintain and support my said daughters free from charge and expence.

Item: It being my first desire to provide a suitable maintenance and support for my wife: it is my Will and desire if the provisions herebefore made for that purpose shall prove insufficient there and in that event it is my Will that it be made up by a bequest by contributions from the property herebefore given and bequeathed to my children: each legatee contributing in proportion to the amount bequeathed.

Item: I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint my son William Stephen Godwyn my son in law J. S. Ridley and my friend George B. Cary Executors of this my last Will and Testament: feeling the utmost reliance that they will observe and carry out that my wishes and desire. Signed this day of September 1848 thousand eight hundred and forty eight in the presence of

 This Last Will and Testament of William S. Godwyn dec<sup>d</sup>: was proved by the Oaths of Geo. W. Dorman and James Hall the subscribing Witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded J. S. Ridley and George B. Cary two of the Executors named in said Will appeared in Court and refused to take upon themselves the burden of the Execution of said Will. On the Motion of William S. Godwyn the former Executor therein named who made oath and together with J. S. Ridley Robert Ridley and Thomas Ridley his securities entered into and acknowledged @ bond in the penalty of fifty thousand dollars. Conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining @ probat of said Will in due form
