New Orleans April 24th 1847

I make and declare this to be my last
Will and Testament. I wish my land in 5th angle to be sold by my executor
who my interest in the steam Boat R. C. Dwell the proceeds of which together
with the money due me to be applied to the payment of my debts. If this shall
not be sufficient to pay my debts then such of my negroes as may be necessary
the balance of my negroes I wish hired out and the proceeds to paid out
equally to my sister Eliza V. Parker during her life and to be paid to her in person
and to her heirs. After her death I leave to my friend Mrs. M. Purdy if she
be alive my two servants old John (and Solomon has wish her) and request that
he give them their hire my intention being to free them. If Mrs. Purdy be not
alive then I give the said servants their freedom. The balance of my property
of every description except five hundred dollars I leave to be equally divided.
