

This Inventory and appraisement of the Estate of Sally Ann Russell, who was returned and ordered to be Recorded,

In the Name of Gott Amen. I Thomas Partidge of the County of Southampton late and State of Virginia do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and form as follows:

I Item 1st I give to my beloved wife two first choice beds and gear and sufficient clothing to her and her heirs forever I also give her my single barrel gun "N" I grant my wife during her life the use of my Negro Slave Edward Rainey and his Wombe.

It is my Will and desire that my Executor hereof Russell do sell the plantation whereon I now live and with the proceeds of such sale buy some place with the consent of my wife which place to purchase of I leave my wife during her life I also give my wife the Interest at all times that may arise from the sale of my debts and funeral expences. 3. All the property herein known by my wife at her death I give to my daughter Mary Francis to her and her heirs forever provided she lives to the age of twenty one or leaves a lawful heir of her body. In the event of my daughter death before attaining to the age of twenty one or without her I give all the property herein named to the children of my wife if she has any and if she has no child then I give the whole of the above property to James & Peter to him and his heirs forever. AND I further do hereby constell and appoint my friend James & Peter Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Testimony of which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 30th day of December 1848.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 15th day of January 1849 This last Will and Testament of Thomas Partidge was proved by the Oaths of R. D. Parker James R. McElroy and William P. Harris the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded. AND at the Motion of James & Peter the Executors Thomas Russell who made oath and together with Sam'l D. Drury for R. D. Parker and Sol'r Drury his son-in-law entered into and acknowledged at Boro in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificated and granted him for obtaining a probate of said Will and Testament

In the Name of Gott Amen. I John Drury of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do hereby make and publish this to be my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following what is to say:

I Item 1st I give unto my daughter Mary Jane Drury and Roger Wombe Russell and her two children Cormand & Richard provided that said Cormand be alway well considered to be sound and fit for inheritance but should the said Cormand not be alway and considerate to be sound then it is my Will and desire that she shall have ^{the} ^{one} ^{fourth} part of my female Negroes also one thousand dollars and an equal portion of my whole estate
