Item 2^d I Give unto my son William H. Drury my whole estate
him and his heirs forever

Item 3^d It is my Will and desire that the whole of my lands shall be
equally divided between my two sons William H. and James H. Drury and
should either of them die before arriving to lawful age or marrying and having
and if one should it is my Will, that my surviving son shall have the whole
of my lands and should both of them die before arriving to lawful age and
having to lawful age then it is my Will, that my daughter or their
descendants shall have the same. It is my Will and desire that the profits arising
from the sale to be applied as I have wished the lands that is to my sons. It
also will to each of my two sons an equal portion each of my whole estate
not before nor hereafter disposed of to them and their heirs forever"

Item 4th I Give unto my daughter Martha Francis Drury one Negro boy
named Sam and her inheritance provided the said Negro is living and considered
to be sound after my death and the same as to others given my son, that is
to be whole and sound after my death but should the same be dead or
considered not to be sound then it is my Will that she the said Martha H.
shall have her choice of any of my female Negroes excepting the one which is
given to Mary Sam I also Give my said daughter Martha Francis one thousand
dollars, and an equal portion of my whole estate not herebefore or hereafter disposed
of to her and her heirs forever"

Item 5th It is my Will and desire that in the event of the death of
any of my children before arriving to lawful age or marrying that the survivor or
survivors shall have the same portion which they would if living be entitled to.

Item 6th It is my Will and desire that my Executor shall use any money
belonging to my estate to keep in repair my Morris and Shippo plantations such
as building or repairing the houses in such a manner as he may think beneficial in
these places, renting for the best price as it is my Will and intention that the
whole of my lands, shall be rented out until my son William H. Drury
arrives to the age of twenty, and at which time I wish my lands as before divided
equally divided between my two sons William H. & James H. Drury provided
they both be living"

Item 7th It is my Will and desire and by this I fully authorize my Executor
to use any money due my estate for the education of my children or for any other
purpose which he may consider necessary for their welfare health and promotion

Item 8th In case I have no child to live to arrive to the age of twenty or
years or marry I Give unto my nephew James B. Sundry one thousand dollars.

Item 9th In case I have no child to live to arrive to the age of twenty or
years or marry: I Give unto my brother Samuel Drury all my lands except those
plantations and house: old field including the place I live on the blue pond tract
Shippo tract and all the land lying in front of my house on the south side of
the road, leading from my house to James Drury's down to a highway, then leading
on the south side of said road not far from the where the old school house formerly
stood from the said highway running as direct line to a oak corner in my late
late James & Wadsworth's land. I also Give him one half of my whole estate
excepting the amt. bequeathed James B. Sundry to him and his heirs forever"

Item 10th In case I have no child to arrive to the age of twenty years
