Clayton has been duly executed: This day came as well the said Unity
A Clayton by her Attorney as the Infants by E. R. Edwards appointed their
Guardians ad litem at the last Court: and thereupon James Clayton being sworn
deposed and said as follows: that the said James C Clayton made the following
verbal Will at his own house and in his last illness in the presence of himself and
others, directed first: that all his debts should be paid; and that his
