

I Joseph C Buxton of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit after all my just debts and burying expences are paid I leave the balance of my estate both Real and Chastle to my beloved wife Nancy Buxton during her Natural life or Widowhood:

Ind I Give the Sum of Twenty of my wife Nancy Buxton I Give to my daughter Elmina Buxton Sixty Dollars and my Daughter Sybil Marions Buxton Sixty Dollars: and I Give to my Daughter Margaret Buxton Sixty Dollars and I Give to my son George Edward Buxton Sixty Dollars and I Give to my daughter Savannah Buxton Sixty Dollars: The Balance of my estate I leave to be equally divided between my children: Namely: Sybil Buxton Mary Buxton Emily Buxton Milford Tullow Elmina Buxton Sybil Marions Buxton Margaret Buxton George Edward Buxton Savannah Buxton: Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute my friend William C Gay Executor to this my last Will and Testament: hereby revoking all other Wills by me at any time heretofore made In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of January 1849

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 14th day of March 1849 This Last Will and Testament of Joseph C Buxton was proved by the Oath of William D. Morris and Sexton & Johnson two of the subscribing Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded: AND ON the Motion of William C Gay the Executor therein named who made Oath and together with Morris D. Morris Sexton & Johnson and S. D. Williams his depositee entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty and thousand dollars conditioned as the said directs Certificate granted him for obtaining a probate of said Will in due form

I Give Sanchford the intent this instrument of writing to be my last Will. I Give to I Give to my wife Sanchford one thousand dollars also half of my household and kitchen furniture also half of my stock of all kinds also half of my farming tools to she and hers: I leave her the following property during her Natural life or her life of Widowhood that is to say the plantation I have been on and following Negroes John Nat. Simon Legler and Sybil and her two children: that is to have the property until her death or Marry: that I Give all the leased property to my son William Sanchford to him and to his heirs forever:

I Give Ind I Give to my Grand Daughter Mary C. McHenry one Negro Girl and four hundred Dollars to she and her heirs:

I Give to my Grand Daughter Marsha & Phipps one Negro Girl Debiter and four hundred Dollars to she and her heirs: I leave in the hands of my son William Sanchford four hundred Dollars also the house of Negro boy Olin also the house of Negro boy Olin also the money which he owed for the hire of the said to Negroes is to go to the said Marsha & Phipps my son William Sanchford is to have the said money and Negroes until my said Grand daughter gets grown and gets married and has children and then I wish William to give up to my said Grand daughter the said Negro and money
