do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
toth after all my just debts and burying expenses and provide for my wife Nancy
of my estate both Real and chattel to my beloved wife Nancy Buxton during
her Natural life or Witschoord:

Ith do give to my wife Nancy Buxton I give to my daughter
Catharine Buxton Sixty Dollars and my Daughter Catarina Buxton Sixty
Dollars; and I give to my Daughter Margaret Buxton Sixty Dollars and
I give to my son George Edward Buxton Sixty Dollars and I give to my Daughter
Sarah Buxton Sixty Dollars. The Balance of my estate I want to equally
divide between my children: namely: Eliza Buxton Mary Buxton Emily
Parson Hilbert Talbot Elmira Buxton Elizabeth Maria Buxton Margaret
Buxton George Edward Buxton Edmund Buxton. Lastly I do hereby nominate
constitute my friend William & Guy Encisor to this my last Will and
Testament: hereby revoking all other Wills by me at any time heretofore made.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 19th day of March 1849
This last Will and Testament of Joseph C. Buxton was proved by the oaths
of William P. Moore and Gosman & Johnson two of the subscribing Witnesses
thereon and ordered to be Recorded. THIS ON THE Motion of William &
Guy the Executors herein named who made oath and together with Garrison D. Moore
Gosman & Johnson and S. D. Williams his associates entered into and acknowledged
and in the penalty one thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs certificati
granted him for obtaining a probate of said Will in due form

Joseph Sandford do witness this instrument of writing to be my last Will
I give to my wife Sandford one thousand dollars also half of
my household and kitchen furniture also half of my stock of all kinds also half of
my farming tools to her and hers: I leave her the following property during her Natural
life or the life of Witschoord that is to say the plantation & house and all following
Negroes three men, Simon Logister and Lucy and her two children: she is to have the
property until her death or marriage when I give all the above property to my son
William Sandford to him and to his heirs forever:

I give to my Grand Daughter Mary & McCleary one hundred Dollars
and four hundred Dollars to her and her heirs:

I give to my Grand Daughter Martha & Pipkin one hundred Dollars and four hundred
Dollars to her and her heirs: I leave in the hands of my son William Sandford for
four hundred Dollars also the sum of twenty five Dollars also the sum of twenty five Dollars
the money which he needs for the hire of the said Negroes to go by the hands of my
Grand Daughter Martha Pipkin my son William Sandford is to hold the said Negro
until my said Grand daughter gets grown and gets married and has children and
can I wish William to give up to my said Grand daughter the said Negro and money
