Item 6th I desire that Nathaniel be supported out of my estate if she should
 ever become destitute of the necessary means of support from other sources:

Item 7th I desire if either or any of my sons shall die under age or without
 leaving lawful heir & heirs that his portion of said shall go to my other sons & if
 also if either one of my daughters shall die without leaving lawful heirs that her
 portion of property shall go to the surviving daughters:

Item 8th I nominate and appoint my friends C. D. Burham & Thos. M.
 Newsum my whole & sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament

 their securities entered into and acknowledged at bond in the penalty of twenty
 thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs: Certificate is granted them for
 obtaining a probate of said Will in due form
