

Item: I appoint my brother Edward P. Turner Executor to my said Son & I request and direct him to have my son Edward Joseph educated in the profession of Law or Medicine, whichever my son may choose; if however it should be thought best not to educate my son for either of the above professions: then I direct that he shall receive such an education as his friends shall think best; provided that he may be well educated; and to this end I authorize his Executors to expend the whole or any portion of the principal and interest of my son's estate that may be necessary;

Item: In the event of my child or children dying unmarried and under age, I direct that their portions of my estate shall go to my surviving child or children in equal proportions;

Item: The authority conferred on my Executor to sell my Son is intended to authorize him to sell the same at such time or such times and in such manner as he shall think best; provided that the direction to sell be received in at reasonable time after my death. But the intent here my Son is to be enjoyed by my wife and my children for their equal benefit; but my said Executor shall not sell my Son unless my wife shall consent to the sale of it; But the intent of my Executor dying before selling my Son I direct that it be not sold but divided as directed in the first part of this Will;

Item: I appoint my brother Edward P. Turner Executor to this my Will and Testament and direct that the Court shall not require security of him; But Testimony whereof I write at my hand and seal this 10th day of April 1841 acknowledged before us by the Testator, and subscribed by us in his presence and at his request

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 16th day of July 1841 This Last Will and Testament of Thomas P. Turner was proved by the Oaths of Jos. H. Prince and John Turner two of the subscribing Witnesses sworn and ordered to be Recorded: And on the Motion of Edward P. Turner the Executor thereof named, who made Oath and gave bond in the penalty of thirty thousand dollars conditioned as the last directs: certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of said Will in due form; (The Will directing that the executor should be sworn and the Court requiring him)
