

privately to some person or persons who will treat him well to labour at the farming  
having only until they can privately set him at a fair price to a good master  
or any person said Jim may choose to buy him as a servant.

3<sup>rd</sup> I bind to my beloved wife Mary Story all my tract of Land and premises  
(whereof I now reside) and the appurtenances thereto belonging during her term of  
her natural life.

3<sup>rd</sup> After the decease of my said wife I give my said tract of Land and premises  
with the appurtenances thereto belonging as follows to my said Son Wm Story  
one fourth part to my Daughter Emilie Whitfield one eighth part to her said  
Emilie Whitfields children one eighth part to my Daughter Martha Ann Story  
one fourth part and to my Daughter Eliza Rebecca Jane Story one fourth  
part to them and their heirs forever.

4<sup>th</sup> I bind to my said wife Mary Story during the term of her natural  
life the following slaves namely: Ann, Amy and Irving; and after her decease  
I give said slaves and the increase of the female Amy if any to my two youngest  
Daughters Martha Ann Story and Eliza Rebecca Jane Story but in case either  
of my said two youngest Daughters Martha Ann Story or Eliza Rebecca Jane  
Story should die without a lawful progeny of her own body then I give said slaves  
said slaves and the increase of the said female Amy if any to the surviving  
one of my said two youngest Daughters and her heirs forever.

5<sup>th</sup> I bind to my said wife Mary Story my Negro Girl Tabitha until my said  
two youngest Daughters Martha Ann Story and Eliza Rebecca Jane Story shall come  
to twenty one age or either of them should marry then I give said Negro Girl Tabitha  
and her increase to my said two youngest Daughters Martha Ann Story and Eliza  
Rebecca Jane Story but in case either of my said two youngest Daughters Martha  
Ann Story or Eliza Rebecca Jane Story should die without a lawful progeny of her  
own body then I give said Negro Girl Tabitha and her increase if any to  
the surviving one of my said two youngest Daughters and her heirs forever.

6<sup>th</sup> I bind to my said wife Mary Story and each of my four children one  
thousand and five hundred apiece.

7<sup>th</sup> I give all the balance of my Estate as follows to wit: To my said wife  
Mary Story, one fifth part to my son Wm W Story one fifth part to my  
Daughter Emilie Whitfield one fourth part to her children Whitfields children  
one tenth part to my Daughter Martha Ann Story one fifth part and to my  
Daughter Eliza Rebecca Jane Story one fifth part to them and their heirs forever.

8<sup>th</sup> And witness: I hereby nominate and appoint my brother Benjamin Story  
and my friend Thomas B. Wrenner Executors of this my last will and testament  
hereby revoking and annulling all other or former Wills and Testaments by me  
herebefore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
affixed my seal this twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord eighteen  
hundred and forty seven.
